

FIRST NATIONS STUDIES 12

B.C. First Nations Studies 12 is a course that addresses the history of First Nations people in B.C. from prior to European contact up to the present day.

There are four modules in the First Nations Studies 12 online course:

- Module 1 – Perspective and Place
- Module 2 – Contact, Resistance and Leadership
- Module 3 – Creativity and Culture
- Module 4 – Contemporary Issues

What resources will I need?

Most of the materials are online but there is a textbook (B.C. First Nations Studies) that is required. (You do NOT need the textbook to START the course)



There are also various readings, videos, animations and simulations that are available online in the course.

How long will this course take?

This is a 4-credit course and you should expect to spend 100 – 120 hours to complete the course.

How will I be assessed?

There are 4 module quizzes (worth 5% each), 4 module tests (worth 10% each), and 8 assignments (two in each module, worth 5% each), in this course.

The tests and quizzes are written online and you will hand in your assignments electronically via a drop box in the course. Each assignment includes specific marking criteria.

After completing the online course, all students (who are completing the 80 credit graduation program) must write the provincial exam worth 20% of your final mark.
